A story about safer sex and condoms





What is sex?




If one is planning on having sex one might want to use protection.

- Contraceptive injection
- IUD (intrauterine device)
- Condom
- Internal condom
- Sterilisation

It's important not to keep condoms with sharp or hard objects, because this can damage them.




Mio is going to a party tonight.

Mio and the guy will meet at the party.




## How many condoms should Mio bring?

After a few hours Mio asks the guy if they should go home together.

The guy says yes!




Home?
